



PROTOCOL GUIDE - PART 2:

FORMS OF ADDRESS FOR MEMBERS OF THE IMPERIAL NOBILITY & FOR PERSONS HOLDING IMPERIAL HONOURS

This document, which should be read in association with Part 1, outlines the correct forms of address to be used in composing text-based communications, in text-based salutations, in direct conversation and in formal introductions, for Members of the Imperial Atlantian Nobility, and for persons holding Imperial Honours.

Nobles and holders of Honours who are members of the Public Administration should always be addressed initially by their official title when communications are conducted within the context of official business. They may then secondarily be addressed according to their Noble Title.

Such persons are also entitled to use the recognized pre- and post-nominals for any Atlantian Noble Title or Imperial Honour which they hold, in text-based communications, in order of precedence.

Titular precedence in Atlantium is as follows:

1. Title within the Public Administration
2. Noble Title
3. Imperial Honours

Thus, a Duke who is a Senator and who also is a Member of the Great Georgian Order would be styled as follows:

VE John Doe, DI, OMG

VE (The Very Eminent) refers to his Senatorial position.

DI (Dux Imperium) refers to his Title of Ducal Nobility

OMG (Ordo Magnus Georgianus) signifies his Membership of the Great Georgian Order

Members of the Imperial Nobility:

Prince (Principes)

Superscription: His Highness Prince John Doe
Commencement: Your Highness
Conclusion: With Profound Honour
Personal Address: Your Highness
Formal Introduction: His Highness Prince John Doe
Titular Pre/post-nominal: HH John Doe, Princeps Imperium (*abbreviated form:* PI)

Duke (Dux)

Superscription: His Grace Duke John Doe
Commencement: Your Grace
Conclusion: With Sincerity and Respect
Personal Address: Your Grace
Formal Introduction: His Grace Duke John Doe
Titular Pre/post-nominal: HG John Doe, Dux Imperium (*abbreviated form:* DI)

Count (Comes)

Superscription: His Excellency Count John Doe
Commencement: Your Excellency
Conclusion: With Sincerity and Regards
Personal Address: Your Excellency
Formal Introduction: His Excellency Count John Doe
Titular Pre/post-nominal: HE John Doe, Comes Imperium (*abbreviated form:* CI)

Titles for female Nobles are expressed in text-based media using the same Latin forms as for male Nobles. English-language feminine forms (Princess, Duchess, Countess) may be used in the case of formal introductions.

Holders of Imperial Honours:

Members of the Great Georgian Order

Superscription: none used
Commencement: Dear Sir or Madam
Conclusion: With Honour,
Personal Address: Sir or Madam
Formal Introduction: The Worthy John Doe
Titular Post-nominal: John Doe, OMG
